

Club News

The Rotary Foundation and our District Grants – an update.

We were particularly successful with our District Grant applications in 2022-2023. Richard Jones put together an excellent application which resulted in a matching payment \$3,750 for Bayside Community Care and their Matt's Place project. Together with our contribution the funds were used to buy food items for their Christmas food hampers and some much-needed kitchen equipment. You may remember seeing this photo of Mark Perelaer and Max Manks helping Ken Mirams pack the food items.



Thanks to some detective work on the part of Richard Potter, the international team visiting Sabu in June were able to establish that there were some District Grant funds still available. Mark, Max and Geoff had identified some furniture and equipment still required for the student's hostel.

In what is the fastest application process I can remember; the team confirmed the items needed on 18th June, the application was sent to district on 19th June, approved on 23rd June and payment of \$2,500 was made into our account on 27th June.

President Denise has already submitted our initial 2023-2024 "wish" list for matching project funding. We should hear more about this in August.



The money we receive as District Grants comes from the contributions Rotarians make to the Rotary Foundation. Since it

was founded more than 100 years ago, the Foundation has spent more than \$4 billion on life-changing, sustainable projects. In 2022/2023 the club and individual members donated a total of A\$8,142, a fraction under \$200 per member. This compares with \$7,887 in 2021/2022 and \$8,109 in 2020/2021.

Our per capita contribution is 26% higher than the District 9810 average. This is a result we can be proud of. In recognition of this Beaumaris Rotary received a Club Annual Donor Award – level 1. This award recognises Clubs who have during the Rotary Year supported TRF with contributions funded from their own programs and activities. 
Fast forward to Tuscany where I bumped into a couple of familiar faces. Kerrie, Heather and I enjoyed a few wines together before they headed off to Florence.
