President's Message

On Saturday August 5, the Fundraising team worked hard to make the Sausage Sizzle at Bunnings Mentone a great success. Fundraising Director Tim Parsons was up at the crack of dawn and managed everything with great enthusiasm and proficiency. Thanks to Tim, Gail Anderson and the 15 volunteers we raised \$3241.08 – a great start to the year.

We have had two very interesting speakers in the past weeks. Sandra Cavallo from Matt's Place (Bayside Community Care) spoke about the many areas of service they provide in the community. Matt's Place provides healthy community meals for those who are struggling due to financial hardship, homelessness, or mental health issues. We have collected nonperishable food items to stock their shelves so that members of the community can provide for their families. We also support the Bayside Community Care Angel Tree Project, providing Christmas gifts for children where a parent is incarcerated in the justice system and unable to purchase gifts themselves. Also at Christmas, Beaumaris Rotary gives financial support for Christmas hampers, and then packs and delivers the hampers where needed. We have supported Bayside Community Care for many years, and we heard Sandra's heart-warming stories that re-invigorated our commitment for years to come.

Our second speaker this last week was Malcolm Peck speaking about The Bushmaster. This is the service vehicle that Australia is sending to the Ukraine to assist in the war effort there. The Bushmaster is a cross between a tractor and a bus, with some fairly impressive other features. It is particularly useful for transporting military personnel safely from one place to another and providing protection for them.

This week we are looking forward to the first of two talks on Sabu from members Max (John) Manks and Mark Perelaer. They travelled to Sabu in June with Geoff Stockdale and others to see first-hand the outcomes of our support for the community there. The second of these talks will be held early next year with a showing of a film taken while they were on the field trip.

DG Ian Ballantine will visit us on August 17th and following his visit we set out for Warracknabeal. Thanks to Clem Quick for initiating this trip to see the painted silos and to meet fellow

Speaker 27 July: Sandra Cavallo Topic: Matts Place & other projects

We welcomed Sandra Cavallo from Bayside Community Care as part of Bayside Community Church. Sandra talked about the value of programmes such as Matt's Place where they welcome up to 70 people each week. They have 50 volunteers a week and see the value of Matt's Place as connection and being known for people, as well as the food. They now open Chatty Cafe at 10.30 am for people to just come and socialise prior to the meal.

They have served over 17,000 meals a year and distributed over 530 hampers in 2022. They intend to start Health and Hearing screening soon. They are also distributing Food Relief.

Their Angel Tree Project, which distributes Christmas presents to the children of people in prison, is based on the belief in the dignity of every person. This links in with the Prison Fellowship Australia and over 8000 children across Australia benefit from it including 119 supported from the Bayside area.

Sandra thanked us several times for our work and support, it was pleasure to have her address us.

Speaker 3 August: Malcolm Peck Topic: The Bushmaster

Malcolm was chosen to revitalise the Australian Defence Industry (ADI) facility at Bendigo and make it a commercial operation. Starting with, literally an empty room, he established an enterprise which has provided excellent equipment for the Australian Defence Forces (ADF) as well as overseas forces.

Starting with a high speed tractor and culminating in the Bushmaster troop transport the ADI has become a key component in Australia's defence procurement infrastructure.

The Bushmaster was the outcome of a contest between two overseas competitors and ADI to supply the ADF with a vehicle which could safely transport troops to the battle front while surviving a range of hazards. From a clean sheet of paper they developed and demonstrated the winning design in around 18 months.

The Bushmaster is currently in service with the Australian Army, Royal Australian Air Force, Royal Netherlands Army, British Army, Japan Ground Self Defense Force, Indonesian Army, Fiji Infantry Regiment, Jamaica Defence Force, New Zealand Army and the Armed Forces of Ukraine.


