Our speaker was Neil Soullier from the Blue Ribbon Foundation (https://remember.org.au/) (photo page). The Foundation perpetuates the memory of Victorian Police officers who have died in the line of duty. Recognition is provided through community memorials and awards. The Foundation also manages the Police Assistance Dog project where highly trained assistance dogs are placed with members of Victoria Police who are suffering from PTSD brought on through stressful work-related incidents. So far, the Foundation has provided funds to 30 hospitals throughout Victoria. We were pleased to provide a donation of \$500 toward their work.

At the recent Board meeting we officially confirmed the transfer of Cheltenham projects to Beaumaris, including a continuing relationship with sister clubs in Bangalore, India, the Royal Hua Hin club in Thailand, and the Yimba Uganda project in Uganda. We will also continue projects with the Southern Autistic School and secondary schools in the Cheltenham area.



Thanks to the efforts of Gail and Tim, Beaumaris Rotary has recently helped support the work of 123Read2Me. 123Read2Me became a registered charity and public benevolent institution in late 2015 seeking to provide quality books and raise awareness of the importance of reading aloud to

disadvantaged children across Australia.

In 2016, the 123Read2Me Children's Literacy Project started in partnership with, and the support of, the Lions Club of Mordialloc-Mentone Inc and a growing number of Lions" districts. This project has helped 123Read2Me collect, sort, pack and



giveaway over 500,000 free books to vulnerable and atrisk children.

Gail and Tim delivered three trays of quality children's books to the Lion's Op Shop in Mordialloc, one of our eight local collection points.



Greetings from RI District 3181!

As you might be aware, RID 3181 organizes an International Motorcycle Ride / Drive event - Ride for Rotary, in India. The aim of the event is to promote international fellowship and exchange of Rotary views.

The last 7 editions of the event have been an overwhelming success. More than 150 participants from 18 different countries have attended the event and have had wonderful experiences to take back home.

The proceeds from this event go to The Rotary Foundation. We have contributed close to \$150,000 to TRF from the last 7 editions.

This year's event will be held from 5th to 20th January 2024. The 15 days event will start-off from Udaipur (India) and can either be a motorcycle ride, or a four-wheeler drive.

The ride will cover multiple Rotary Districts and many Rotary Clubs. Route map will be - Udaipur - Ahmedabad - Statue of Unity - Surat - Nashik - Pune - Kolhapur - Goa - Mysore

Below are the Event Highlights:

- "Ride for Rotary" is an event involving motorcycle riding and four-wheeler driving across India.
- This initiative is organized by Rotary District 3181 to support and strengthen The Rotary Foundation while celebrating Rotary Fellowship.
- The journey will encompass visits to various Rotary
 Clubs, insights into Rotary Projects, enjoyable fellowships, and opportunities to meet new people.
- Participants will have the chance to experience diverse cultures, cuisines, and lifestyles along the route.
- Cultural activities and a Gala Dinner will be featured throughout the journey.
- Accommodation will be provided in 3-star hotels or higher.
- The meticulously planned route will showcase diverse landscapes, including palaces, beaches, hill stations, temples, and churches, covering approximately 1600 km



across 5 Indian states.

- The ride will be supported by medical staff, helpers, mechanics, and support vehicles.
- A Minibus will transport participants' luggage.
- The bike and four-wheeler convoy will be under the guidance of experienced crew members.


