There are many challenges to obtaining health care in PNG and the maternal and infant death rates are amongst the highest in the world. THF is committed to reducing those figures. In addition they support health care workers in their education as midwives. Shan Podolakin is Donations Project Manager at THF She had first-hand experience working as a nurse in PNG in the 1970s and has worked tirelessly for THF managing dona-

tions of goods for packing days. THF is also supporting a new initiative in the Highlands, where women can be screened for gynaecological cancers.

Heather is a Past President of the Rotary Club of Beaumaris and is highly respected within our club. Heather was the lynchpin of our Farmers Market for many years and established an Interact group at the Beaumaris campus of what was then Sandringham Secondary College. She has initiated many fundraising events for THF and contributes to others through her legendary service.

Fiona Gathercole is a Director of Team Sports 4 All, a charity that helps socioeconomically disadvantaged children aged 5-18yrs, who come from the poorest and most marginalised parts of our society participate in club sport in their community. She is a firm believer in building a strong inclusive community and the positive impact this can have on disadvantaged youth, positively impacting their physical and mental health, and improving their confidence and sense of worth.

Cameron Dare is Chairman and Director of Team Sports 4 All and describes sporting clubs as a Good Gang for young, marginalised kids. He was speaker here in July this year and spoke about the extension of TS4A into the Western suburbs, where 8000 children live on welfare. He outlined plans to further extend TS4A to Greater Dandenong, Manningham and Whitehorse regions.





New Black Rock Farmers Market


New Black Rock Farmers Market.

You'll find 40+ stallholders selling fresh seasonal Victorian produce. Come down and enjoy the community vibe.

This will be the first market with a new organisation, Community Farmers Markets <u>https://www.communityfarmersmarkets.com.au/</u> They will be organising and managing the produce focused stallholders. Community Farmers Markets (CFM) came from an idea to establish an umbrella organisation for independent market organisers and operators as a way to develop supportive relationships, share knowledge and provide information.



We will be adding a dedicated Farmers Market page to our website next week and CFM have a added a Black Rock Farmers Page to their website <u>https://www.communityfarmersmarkets.com.au/black-rock-farmers-market</u> which will build as we get more material. We have also purchased all new signage for the surrounding streets and the market itself.
