We had 34 members and partners attend our first Fellowship event on Friday 19th at Onyx. Our speaker was Suzy George a First Aid Trainer, who gave a very information presentation. She demonstrated how to use a Defibrillator, or compression if one is not available, for CPR. Fortunately, the defibrillator speaks to you, guiding you through each stage. She also covered what to do for spider bites (apparently there are funnel web spiders in Victoria) and the use of EpiPens. Suzy also talked us through the assessment of a person who has suffered a stroke using the FAST acronym – Face (facial droop), Arms (inability to lift arms), Speech (slurred speech) and Time (Time to call 000).

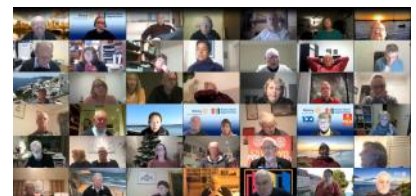

- **February 1st** is a Club Information night with presentations from our Directors on their plans for the next 5 months.
- On **February 8th** our speakers are Anne Marie & Emmanuel who will talk on the Yimba Uganda project. This was one of Cheltenham's projects that we were pleased to support. The project empowers young people to develop income generating skills.

Our new market, retaining the Black Rock Farmers Market brand, is held on the second Saturday of the month, starting 9 December, from 8am - 12.30pm in the Royal Avenue reserve, Sandringham - next to the Bayside council buildings. You'll find 40+ stallholders selling fresh seasonal Victorian produce. Come down and enjoy the community vibe.

This will be the first market with a new organisation, Community Farmers Markets <https://www.communityfarmersmarkets.com.au/> They will be organising and managing the produce focused stallholders. Community Farmers Markets (CFM) came from an idea to establish an umbrella organisation for independent market organisers and operators as a way to develop supportive relationships, share knowledge and provide information.

We will be adding a dedicated Farmers Market page to our website next week and CFM have added a Black Rock Farmers Page to their website <https://www.communityfarmersmarkets.com.au/black-rock-farmers-market> which will build as we get more material. We have also purchased all new signage for the surrounding streets and the market itself.
