He worked for National Parks in Victoria and Tasmania for 35 years.

He has also taught ecology at Deakin Uni, and ecosystem management at Holmesglen TAFE.

He is Convenor of the Friends of Long Hollow in Beaumaris, and also volunteers at Bayside Community Nursery in Reserve Rd.

In 2018 he received an Australia Day Environmental Award from Bayside City Council for outstanding community services to the environment.

Flynn's Walk is a small and emerging Australian registered charity and endorsed deductible gift recipient (DGR).

We're working to bring together the community, encourage meaningful conversations and spread awareness of the unique stressors that can impact the wellbeing of people working in the veterinary industry.

Our foundation

Flynn's Walk was started in 2018 following the incredibly sad loss of Dr Flynn Hargreaves (BVSc). Flynn died by suicide and the walk was created to honour his memory, bring together the community and spread awareness of the mental health issues faced by veterinary professionals in their line of work

We have held five editions of Flynn's Walk in Melbourne and in May 2021, expanded to Canberra. The walk has also expanded to hold annual events in Sydney and Brisbane, as well smaller one off events in Adelaide, Hobart, Perth and Toowoomba.

Since our inception over 5 years ago, we have evolved to be an Australian registered charity and have been endorsed as a deductible gift recipient (DGR).

We now fundraise for our own mission and aim to direct funds towards a number of initiatives. These include: raising much needed awareness in the community, particular among pet owners; celebrating the important and diverse roles veterinary and para-veterinary professional play in our community; and creating opportunities and resources for vet and para-vet professional to increase their wellbeing and career sustainability.

Why veterinarians?

There are some alarming stats surrounding the welfare of vets - one study showed that veterinarians are four times more likely to die by suicide than the general population - and two times more likely than other medical professionals.

According to data from the Australian Veterinary Association, this means we lose a vet to suicide about every 12 weeks

Flynn's Walk is aiming to help spread awareness of the issues faced by vets and hopefully contribute to breaking down the stigma that surrounds suicide and other serious mental health issues.


