To see the need for volunteers to host families like Elina's and donations to cover the cost of travel was very evident and our club donates \$2000 to ROMAC each year.. We wish Elina a speedy recovery.

Yesterday we held the Community Market with a small number of stall holders, partly due to the weather and the holiday weekend. Thanks to all the volunteers that attended.

As we draw closer to the end of the Rotary year there is still work to be done and the Highlands Foundation are calling for donated items and help at their Packing Day on June 22nd.
