By partnering with INA, you enable children like Lester in vulnerable communities to **achieve their dreams!** Please read the story of Lester, a 7th grade student from Leyte, The Philippines, and know you play an essential role in positively changing the lives of children just like him.

Growing up on a farm was never easy for Lester, he had to study hard and be responsible for his younger siblings.



Most of the population in his town is made up of farmers. His father is a farmer, while her mother is a housewife and the combined income for the family is only AUD 500 per month and sometimes less, which is not enough to cover their expenses and adequately take care of their five children. The most challenging time comes when the family waits for the crops to be harvested. During those months they need to look hard for other means of income, such as pulling out weeds from farmland, applying fertilizer, and spraying pesticides for other farm owners.

Lester helps his parents on the farm on Saturdays and together with his older brother, he brings home the carabao from the farm every day after school. He knows the hardships of his parents, so he strives to do well in school and hopes to be a policeman in the future to help provide for his family. He is very thankful for the support that he receives from INA's ChildLink program. Despite the difficulties, he and his family remain resilient and have hope for the future thanks to the help they receive from INA and supporters like you.
